

## DESIGN CLASS

### 2025 Theme: "TOWN AND COUNTRY"

(Open to Adults and Youth.) Home-grown or wildflowers, grasses and greens, fresh or dried, natural and/or fabricated accessories are permitted. The container is considered an integral part of the design.

1. **A Weed Is But An Unloved Flower.** A design incorporating plants commonly considered weeds.
2. **Never Say No To Veggies!** A centerpiece design primarily featuring vegetables.
3. **Green's My Vibe.** Celebrating the various greens found in nature.
4. **Joyfully Bold.** A large and vibrant bouquet.
5. **Quiet Reflection.** A simple design featuring water or any reflective surface.
6. **It Makes Scents.** Herbs or other sensory plants arranged in a teacup
7. **The Sky's the Limit.** A vertical arrangement suggesting a city skyline or skyscraper.

## YOUTH DESIGN CLASS

Any Youth under 18 (as of July 12, 2025) may enter any or all of these categories. **POINTS** will be awarded for each Youth Design category:

1 <sup>st</sup>	5 points	3 <sup>rd</sup>	2 points
2 <sup>nd</sup>	3 points	Entry	1 point

All entries will receive at least 1 point. Participants with the highest **total** of points will win one of the four (4) cash prizes:

Highest overall points	\$25	Third overall points	\$15
Second overall points	\$20	Fourth overall points	\$10

1. **You Got To Move It!** A design inspired by your favourite sport.
2. **Loose and Wild.** Plants, rocks, twigs and other things found on a nature walk, artfully displayed on a 10"-12" plate.
3. **Carnival of Flowers.** A bright and colourful arrangement.

## SPECIMEN CLASS

The Specimen Class is open to Youth and Adults.

Articles are judged for perfection of bloom, stem and/or leaves. No filler or accessories; all entries must be in a stable vase or container.

**TIPS:** Cut flowers and foliage the evening before the show or in the early morning. Store in a cool dark place; re-cut stem ends before placing in show containers. Grooming is essential.

### Marigolds (Tagetes) (p. 87 OJES)

1. Three stems yellow, same variety
2. Three stems orange, same variety
3. Three stems any other colour
4. One stem miniatures (eg. Gems)

### Dahlia (p. 59 OJES)

5. One bloom over 4 inches
6. One bloom under 4 inches
7. Three Pompon, same variety
8. Three blooms, mixed varieties

### Rose (p. 96 OJES)

9. One bloom of any variety
10. One spray of any variety

### Zinnia (p. 106 OJES)

11. Three blooms over 3", same variety
12. Three blooms under 3", same variety
13. Three orange blooms, any variety
14. Three stems, any other variety

### Pelargonium (Annual Geranium) (p. 92 OJES)

15. One stem, with foliage

### Other

16. Any other annual not already listed. Must be named.

### Echinacea (Coneflower) (p. 66 OJES)

17. Three blooms, same variety

### Day Lilies (Hemerocallus) (p. 64 OJES)

18. One scape, any variety

### Rudbeckia (Black-eyed Susan) (p. 99 OJES)

19. Three blooms, same variety

### Other

20. Any other perennial or biennial not already listed. Must be named.

### Hydrangea (Inflorescence) (p. 77 OJES)

21. One panicle (flower head) on stem or branch, any variety

### Hosta (p. 76 OJES)

*Leaf size is determined by multiplying the length from the leaf tip to the intersection with the petiole, by the width of the leaf at its widest point.*

LARGE: 64"-120" MEDIUM: 30"-119" SMALL: 6"-29" MINI: less than 6"

22. Three Large leaves, any colour, same variety
23. Three Medium leaves, any colour, same variety
24. Three Small leaves, any colour, same variety
25. Three Miniature leaves, any colour, same variety

### Heuchera (Coral Bells) (p. 75 OJES)

26. Three leaves, same variety
27. Three stems of bloom, same variety

### Plants

*All entries in this section must have been owned for at least 3 months.*

28. Succulent (one variety). Must be named. (p. 101 OJES)
29. Flowering houseplant in bloom. Must be named. (p. 42 OJES)
30. Houseplant grown for foliage. Must be named. (p. 43 OJES)
31. Patio Planter. Variety of plants growing in a single open container.
32. Any other potted plant. Must be named.
